On our August issue, there are lots of other activities like sharing program, One Billion Rising, voice of elected social activist, Media monitoring.



Sankalpa supported to flood & landslides victims focusing on women and children of 13 most affected districts (Siraha, Saptari, Udayapur, Mahottari, Banke, Kailali, Bardiya, Jhapa, Sunsari, Morang, Dhanusha, Rautahat and Lalitpur) through member organizations. Sankalpa handover shawl to member organization for distribution. Member organization coordinated with

Natural disaster & rescue committee in the districts with the support of local people for support. Apart from shawl, Sankalpa handover taurpaulin,mosquito net,towel,Mattress to 'Nepal Chepang Women Association 'to distribute especially for post-natural women.Sankalpa staff also contributed one day salary as well as board members also contributed for flood and landslide victim.

Monitoring Visit

This August, Sankalpa board member had monitoring visit in Siraha ,Bardiya,Saptari & Banke.This monitoring visit was made to understand the status of women & children in flood affected area, security of women in

the camp, whether they have got support or not. This monitoring visit oversees the overall status of women and children of 13 highly affected district

Sharing program on "Situational analysis of women in Kavrepalanchowk district "was organized on 30th of July, 2017 at Sankalpa premises among Sankalpa staff and member organizations. Sankalpa completed research on situational analysis in Kavre district with the support of Gender studies department & women studies department of Padmakanya College (PK). This study focused to assess and document existing status of women in the

study area and their access in public services including the situation of service delivery

presently existing there. The data reveals that the educational status of the women is not very satisfactory.

Voice Of Elected Social Activist

Dhaula Devi Rawal is a dweller of Sikhar municipal of Doti district. She belongs to an average peasant family and lives with her mother-in-law, disabled husband and her two sons. She is a social activist of Sankalpa. She used to do community service before joining Sankalpa. She received several capacity building opportunities including trainings and seminars provided by Sankalpa. She says "It is my big opportunity when I got chance to become one of the candidate in local election representing Nepali Congress for the post of deputy mayor". It was her first time when she believed in herself and felt that women can do anything with an effort and hard work. All her dedication and



determination became worthwhile when she secured her position as Deputy Mayor of Sikhar municipality, Doti. She shared that Sankalpa has helped a lot to groom her through its trainings to women participants in local election. She added that "Sankalpa/Ruwduc has a huge hand for my success. While working as social activists of Sankalpa, I got opportunity to participate in number of trainings on leadership, VAW and women empowerment. I have gained lot of confidence and motivation through the programs organized by Sankalpa and took a courageous step to participate in local election in a post of Deputy Mayor". I am feeling happy and nervous too. I have a responsibility towards my state and I am looking forward to serve my state.

"I was really scared because my education was only limited to adult literacy whereas my opponent was educated till B. Ed. Though lots of people had positive thoughts towards me and supported me I used to get scared at times.
