paper of thematic issues of women based on constitution and other women related polices and laws. The sharing program was organized by Sankalpa Research Unit and also has

planned to make it a periodic discussion programme in the coming months.

Ms. Mira Dhungana highlighted the key issues of women mentioned in the constitution of Nepal. Her presentation was based on the issues of citizenship, SGBV, child marriage, Rape, Polygamy etc.

The session culminated into a floor discussion where participant's raised issues that need to be interpolated in the analysis paper such participation of Dalit women decision/policy making level, making law to provide equal opportunity for intellectual disabilities. issuina citizenship in the name of mother for those whose father's status disappeared etc.
